On motion of Hon. Mr. GERRARD, Bill (No. 212) – The Human Rights Code Amendment Act (Bullying)/Loi modifiant le Code des droits de la personne (intimidation), was read a First Time and had its purposes outlined.

The following petitions were presented and read:

Mr. PEDERSEN – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Provincial Government to re-open Beausejour's Employment Manitoba. (C. Schmidt, R. Sinnott, L. Bargert and others)

Mr. WISHART – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Provincial Government to not raise the PST without holding a provincial referendum. (C. Sampson, R. Sampson, B. McCorrister and others)

Mr. EWASKO – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request that the Minister of Infrastructure and Transportation recognize that Cape Coppermine Road can no longer adequately serve both area residents and tourists and as such consider making improvements to the road to reflect its current use.
