

AN ORDER OF THE CLEAN ENVIRONMENT COMMISSION

UNDER THE CLEAN ENVIRONMENT ACT

RE: THE CLEAN ENVIRONMENT COMMISSION AND WESTERN SCRAP METALS (1972) LTD.,
Applicant,

WHEREAS pursuant to the provisions of The Clean Environment Act, Western Scrap Metals (1972) Ltd. filed an application with the Department of Mines, Resources and Environmental Management in connection with an existing operation for the storing, cutting, sorting and handling of scrap metal, the said operation being located at or near 18 Sutherland Avenue in the City of Winnipeg, Manitoba;

AND WHEREAS in the absence of limits being prescribed by a Regulation under the said Act, the said application was referred to The Clean Environment Commission for the prescribing of limits;

AND WHEREAS a representation was made to the said Commission by a person who is, or who is likely to be, affected by an Order of the Commission prescribing limits in connection with the said operation;

AND WHEREAS the said Commission held a public hearing on the 7th day of July, 1975, in Winnipeg, Manitoba;

AND WHEREAS the said Commission considered the application on the 14th day of October, 1975;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT

1. The Applicant shall ensure that solid particulate emissions from any process of the said operation do not exceed 0.57 grams per standard cubic meter calculated at 20 degrees Celsius and 760 millimeters of mercury (0.25 grains per standard cubic foot calculated at 68 degrees Fahrenheit and 29.92 inches of mercury) at the point of emission.
2. The Applicant shall ensure that smoke emissions from any part of the said operation shall not exhibit an opacity in excess of forty percent (equivalent to No. 2 on the Ringelmann Smoke Chart*) for a period totalling more than four minutes in one-half hour, nor more than eight continuous minutes at the point of emission.
