

AN ORDER OF THE CLEAN ENVIRONMENT COMMISSION

UNDER THE CLEAN ENVIRONMENT ACT

RE: THE CLEAN ENVIRONMENT COMMISSION AND DEN-CHES ENTERPRISES LTD., Applicant,

- WHEREAS pursuant to the provisions of The Clean Environment Act, Den-Ches Enterprises Ltd. submitted an application to The Clean Environment Commission to prescribe limits in connection with an operation for the collection, storage and stripping of unserviceable automobiles located on Lot 118 on Springfield Road in the Rural Municipality of Springfield, Manitoba;
- AND WHEREAS a representation was made to the said Commission by a person who was, or who was likely to be, affected by an Order of the Commission prescribing limits in connection with the said operation;
- AND WHEREAS the said Commission held a public hearing on the 23rd day of May, 1972, in the City of Winnipeg;
- AND WHEREAS the decision of the said Commission was deferred pending a review of all industries in the area which might be creating environmental problems;
- AND WHEREAS the said Commission considered the said application on the 12th day of January, 1976.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT

1. The Applicant shall ensure that there is no open burning on the site of the said operation.
2. The Applicant shall ensure that liquid wastes from the said operation are handled and controlled in such a manner as to prevent the contamination of surface water and groundwater at any point off the site of the said operation.



The Applicant shall ensure that, on and after the 31st day of December, 1976, the unserviceable vehicles and other wastes accumulated on the site of the said operation are effectively screened from view by persons using Springfield Road, in a manner approved by the Environmental Management Division of the Department of Mines, Resources and Environmental Management.
